A Message from our Scholarship Committee Chairman...

In response to questions from brother Knights, I've offered to describe the process and criteria by which we select a scholarship winner. Applicants for the Knights' Culver Memorial Scholarship must be practicing Catholics, graduating seniors at Seattle-area high schools, and members of St. John Vianney Parish. They were required to submit the following materials to the scholarship committee, in care of the SJV office, by May 1, 2007: application form, answers to two essay questions, high school transcript, and a new requirement: two letters of recommendation from adults who are not relatives of the applicant. Applicants were urged, but not required, to make one of the letters from Jan Kline, SJV's Youth Minister.

(The scholarship committee intended to change the request for a letter of reference from Jan to read that it could come from Fr. Mike or any SJV staff member, partly so as not to put too much pressure on Jan, and partly to enable students who are less active in the youth group—but who participate in parish life in other ways—to have an equal opportunity to provide pastoral endorsements. I also wanted to move the deadline to May 15 because it was now mid-April when the application process got underway.

You may need a calculator to come up with it being our 67th State Convention. I'm beginning to feel rusty.

As it turned out, I asked my wife, Laura, to have Jan read over the application form before I made these changes. My intent was to send out the forms myself, but Jan liked the form just fine, and in keeping with past practice, she sent out the application forms herself without my awareness, and before the new form was delivered to church. We received the same number of applications we usually get, and Jan had no problem writing honest and unbiased letters. All's well that ends well, I think.)

On the application form, the students were to provide their approximate high school GPA, class quartile rank, a list of extra-curricular activities (clubs, sports, hobbies, work, etc.), and a separate list of community service activities

The committee considered the following criteria in determining the scholarship recipients (listed in no order of importance): the committee's estimate of the applicant's likelihood of success in higher education, taking into consideration past academic performance and the recommendations of adults; service to community and church, including work experience if applicable; and other factors considered pertinent by the committee.

Finally, applicants were required to write two, 200- to 250-word essays on each of the following topics:

- How has being Catholic influenced your personal, academic and career goals?
- What visions or dreams do you have for your future as a result of being able to attend a college, university, or technical school?
